He is widely regarded as one of the world's foremost paleontologists, noted for his fieldwork in Montana where he has amassed one of America's largest dinosaur collections. Horner is a recipient of the MacArthur Fellowship "genius grant," and has been awarded two honorary doctorates, one from the University of Montana, the school he attended. Horner has published more than 150 professional papers, nine popular books, and has been the subject of numerous tv documentaries and magazine articles. He served as the technical adviser for all five of the Jurassic Park movies, and was the inspiration for the movie's lead character, Dr. Alan Grant.

Jack Horner is a Presidential Fellow at Chapman University in Orange, California where he teaches honors students to think creatively and out of the box like dyslexics. He is a paleontologist known for his groundbreaking discoveries of the first dinosaur eggs in the Western Hemisphere, the first evidence of dinosaur colonial nesting, the first evidence of parental care among dinosaurs, and the first dinosaur embryos.

He is currently working on a developmental biology project to attempt to retro-engineer dinosaur characteristics that have been lost during the evolution of dinosaurs to birds by creating what he calls a 'chickenosaurus.' He is also the Content Director of Horner Science Group, which is the umbrella company for Jack Homer's World of Dinosaurs, producers of edutainment products for kids such as computer apps, museum exhibitions, and multimedia.
